- <u>Aspirational Thresholds</u>: Levels of performance that would earn the maximum of 10 excellence points in the PBF System.
- Annual Targets: Goals articulated in annual Accountability Plans, approved by the NCF Board of Trustees, and submitted to the Board of Governors. These targets are based on previous performance and the performance of peer institutions.
- <u>Minimum Acceptable Thresholds</u>: Levels of performance that would earn **no** excellence points in the PBF system.

More detailed information on each metric is provided on the following pages. When possible, the performance of New College is compared to that of four groups of institutions:

- <u>SUS</u>: 11 other institutions in the Florida State University System




















