SUBJECT: Degree Requirements

PROPOSED BOARD ACTION

1. Approval of changing the current graduation requirement of "The satisfactory completion of 31 academic units" to "The satisfactory completion of 120 credit hours."

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Board of Governors (BOG) mandates that most degree programs within the State University System (SUS) be limited to 120 credit hours. Programs exceeding this limit (typically those in specialized fields like engineering, nursing, or architecture) require explicit BOG approval. Since our standard 31-unit requirement, where most units are 4 credit hours, surpasses the 120-hour limit, every existing degree program at the college is currently non-compliant with BOG regulations.

The proposed policy adjustment will resolve this issue, bringing the college into immediate compliance with the BOG. This change is not expected to significantly alter our broader academic program or specific areas of concentration.

This modification was presented to the Educational Policy Committee, which raised no objections, and is scheduled for a full faculty vote this academic year.

SUBJECT: Two General Education Courses for 2027-28

PROPOSED BOARD ACTION

1. Approve as General Education Electives for AY 27-28 two courses, Physics II with Algebra (PHY 2054) and Physics II with Calculus (PHY 2049).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The 120-credit hour degree requirement poses a specific challenge for two concentrations, Chemistry and Biochemistry, as their current degree requirements necessitate 121 credit hours for completion.

To resolve this, it is proposed that the required Physics II course be approved to also satisfy a general education elective requirement. This allowance would decrease the total credit hour requirement for these majors to 117.

While the majority of our general education mandates are "Enduring Human Questions", Chemistry majors will continue to complete a minimum of three such courses. Furthermore, the inclusion of Physics II, a highly rigorous course, ensures the continued academic integrity of our general education program.

A more extensive list of general education proposals will be presented to the Board in the Spring.

SUBJECT: Performance-Based Metric 8b

PROPOSED BOARD ACTION

- 1. Approval of retaining performance-based funding metric 8b with new benchmarks.
- 2. Authorize the President to make necessary adjustments to the performance-based funding metric as needed prior to submission to the Board of Governors.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Board of Governors is making substantive changes to the system of Performance-Based Funding (PBF), now in its tenth year, that tracks SUS colleges on ten separate metrics and distributes money to top performers. The changes include (1) instead of all SUS institutions competing with each other with a fixed series of goals, each institution will develop an individualized set of benchmarks and goals; and (2) while the previous system rewarded both excellence and improvement year over year as two separate scoring mechanisms, the new system incorporates both excellence and improvement as a single set of benchmarks per metric.

PBF metric 8 applies only to graduate programs. When the metrics were introduced, New College had only one small graduate program; as a result, we were granted a separate metric, which is currently "Percent of Newly Admitted FTICs with a HS GPA of 4.0 or Higher." For the purpose of future evaluation, we were given the opportunity to suggest a different metric, but ultimately have chosen to retain this one, which is well aligned with our goals. The attachment shows our proposed benchmarks for this metric, with the goal of moving from last year's 42.1% to 50% by 2030.

If this metric change is approved by the BOT it will be presented and approved by the Board of Governors at a future meeting.

Provide a rationale for the metric described above:

New College would like to continue using the current Metric 8b, Percentage of Newly Admitted FTICs with a High School GPA of 4.0 or Higher. As Florida's designated public honors college and a nationally recognized leader among small liberal arts institutions, New College is committed to academic excellence and student success. Our mission is to "develops within students the capacity to think critically and humanely and to conduct themselves with civility, courage, and honor." A core component of fulfilling this mission is our goal to "recruit top-flight students who crave a demanding, stimulating college experience." Maintaining Metric 8b aligns directly with this goal. By continuing with the current metric, New College can focus on attracting high-achieving students who are most likely to thrive within our rigorous academic environment. This alignment supports the College's educational philosophy, strengthens its core academic profile, and reinforces a business model centered on student excellence and long-term success.

Describe rationale for the benchmarks and increments:

Following the same methodology the BOG data team used to establish other metrics in the Model 2.0 framework, we have utilized our most recent score of 42.1% for the fall 2024 FTIC cohort and assigned this as our score of 5. To determine the increment, we have selected a goal of 50% based on our 2025 Accountability Plan approved goals, and applied the same goal here.

SUBJECT: Performance-Based Metric 10

PROPOSED BOARD ACTION

- 1. Approval of new metric 10 with proposed benchmarks.
- 2. Authorize the President to make necessary adjustments to the performance-based funding metric as needed prior to submission to the Board of Governors.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Performance-Based Funding (PBF) Metric 10 was an individualized metric chosen by each institution's Board of Trustees. As every institution was receiving nearly a perfect score of 10 on this metric, the Board of Governors is changing it to something less predictable. Colleges were offered a variety of possible metrics to choose from which aligned with the Board of Governors' master plan. We have chosen "Percent of Baccalaureate Graduates Completing 1+ Internships." This is an area in which we are currently doing well and have plans to do better; our rate of 37.7% last year is not far from the BOG SUS 2030 goal of 40% systemwide. Our proposed benchmarks predict a rise of two percentage points each year, reaching 47.7% in 2030.

If this metric change is approved by the BOT it will be presented and approved by the Board of Governors at a future meeting.

Provide a rationale for the metric selected above:

New College would like to select "Percent of Bachelor's Degree Completers with internships" as our Performance-Based Funding Metric 10. Internships are a well-established high-impact practice and are deeply embedded in the New College curriculum. Through internship experiences, students are able to connect and apply what they learn in the classroom to real-world professional settings, explore potential career paths, strengthen both technical and professional competencies, and build valuable career networks. These advantages directly contribute to stronger employment prospects and improved long-term outcomes for graduates.

Our internal analyses shows that New College graduates who completed an internship were more than twice as likely to be employed or enrolled in further education within one year of graduation compared to those who did not. Beginning in the 2023–2024 academic year, the College expanded internship opportunities and increased scholarship support to encourage greater student participation. These efforts reflect our commitment to enhancing career readiness and ensuring that our graduates enter the workforce or advanced study with meaningful, hands-on experience that positions them for success.

Describe rationale for the benchmarks and increments:

Following the same methodology the BOG data team used to establish other metrics in the Model 2.0 framework, we have utilized our most recent score of 37.7% from the 2023-2024 graduating baccalaureate class, and assigned this as our score of 5.
