



Tuition	Tuition is the basic fee charged for instruction provided by a public postsecondary educational institution in Florida. In some contexts matriculation is synonymous with tuition.
Non-Resident Fee	The non-resident fee is an additional fee charged to a student for instruction provided by a public postsecondary educational institution in Florida who does not qualify for in-state tuition pursuant to s.1009.21.
Tuition Differential	Tuitional differential is a supplemental fee charged for instruction provided by a public university in Florida pursuant to s.1009.24(15). This fee is used to support undergraduate educational programs and services.
Financial Aid Fees	The financial aid fees are set by the Florida State Legislature and not to exceed 5% of the resident tuition and non-resident fee. At least 75% of the revenue generated by these fees must be used to support need based financial aid.
Capital Improvement Trust Fund	The capital improvement trust fund fee exists to provided educational and support facilities for students, faculty and staff in a manner that maximizes the effectiveness of the capital investments, the use of existing facilities, and promotes orderly, planned campus development.
Activities and Service Fee	The student activities and service (A&S) fee supports activities and operations managed by the student government organization to improve services that benefit the general student body.
Health Fee	The health fee supports student health operations and provide access to the Counseling & Wellness Center (CWC) with many services offered at little or no direct cost to the student.
Athletic Fee	The athletic fee supports the university's athletic programs and enables students to attend athletic events with no direct cost to the student.
Technology Fee	The technology fee supports technology dedicated to academic programs.
